### **BOARD MINUTES**

## September 28, 2023

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Charlotte Community Library, County of Eaton, State of Michigan held as a regular meeting on September 28<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m.

President Borrelli called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

**Approval of Agenda**: Member Wilson motion to approve the agenda with addition of Board Member Allocation to Old Business. Member Cook seconded the motion. Motion passed.

**Public Comments: None** 

**Approval of Minutes**: Member Wilson motions to approve the drafted minutes of the August 17, 2023, with minor correction. Member Dyer seconded the motion. Motion passed.

**Financial Report**: Member Tirrell motions to approve the financial report and pay current bills with additional bills to US Bank Equipment Finance (\$838.69) and Duke's Spray (\$44.00). Member Dyer seconded the motion. Motion passed.

### **Director's Report**:

As printed; highlights include:

- <u>Executive Summary</u>: Fall programming is underway. September is Library Card Sign-up month, and the library is participating in that initiative. We are again issuing school cards to all CPS students and those at St. Mary as well.
- <u>Staff:</u> Two staff members will be attending the Michigan Library Association's Annual Conference held the week of October 18<sup>th</sup> in Kalamazoo. The Director of Youth Services will serve as Chair of the Children's Manual Committee for the Collaborative Summer Library Program.
- Marketing: The Library is currently kicking off a "We Read Library Books" Yard Sign Campaign.
  Patrons may pick up a complimentary yard sign at the Circulation Desk to display in their yard
  throughout the month of October. The library purchased 100 and the Friends of the Library
  agreed to fund another 100 signs.
- <u>Facilities/Collection/Services:</u> Gate Count August 2023 = 6,260 − August 2022 = ¬5,699 − July 2021 = 5,529. The county notified the library that our Parks Grant Partnership with the City of Charlotte was fully funded with \$5k in reimbursement. The new 100% recyclable made, ADA compliant, picnic table has been ordered along with two industrial waste receptacles. Each of those is also made from 100% recycled plastic and accommodates both trash and recycling. These items are expected to arrive near the end of October.

- <u>Collection:</u> The Library purchased four passes to Impression 5 Science Center. Each pass allows for four to enter the science center. Passes check out for one week. Funds to purchase these annual passes came through our Woodlands Cooperative via their annual Innovation Grant. The funds must be used for the public/patrons. The library is adding more games to our Beyond Books collection as well. A recent addition was a set of Jumbo Index Waterproof Playing Cards. They are large print and waterproof. These were purchased by the Charlotte Lion's Club.

### **Old Business:**

- <u>"Your Library Yes! Committee:</u> Committee divided into smaller committees for focus on specific things (e.g., Marketing, List of Individuals in Areas, etc.). The informational brochure was finalized and awaiting to be given out. Next meeting is October 10<sup>th</sup>.
- <u>Lawn Sign Campaign:</u> Patrons may pick up a complimentary yard sign at the Circulation Desk to display in their yard throughout the month of October. The library purchased 100 and the Friends of the Library agreed to fund another 100 signs. Starting on October 1<sup>st</sup>, daily drawings will take place for those who have signs to potentially win a prize collected from local businesses who are sponsors.
- <u>Letter to Municipalities:</u> To ask the township/city to join the Charlotte Community Library District Library meaning the millage would be placed on the individual ballots. Member Tirrell motions to approve and mail letters and drafted resolution to municipalities as presented. Member Wilson seconded the motion. Motion passed.

### **New Business:**

- Board Member Allocation: Potential addition of five municipalities would mean the number of board members would change. There are guidelines within the current District Library agreement.
- <u>Board Training:</u> President Borrelli suggestion that it may be good for someone from the Woodlands Cooperative to give an "orientation" to the board members.
